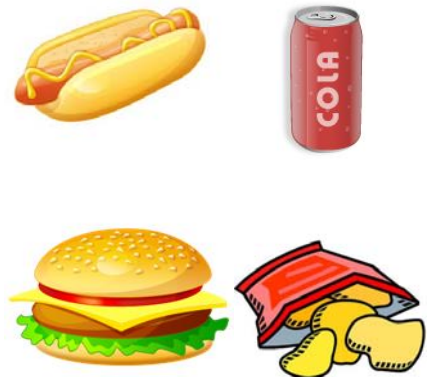

The Living Our Faith parent group began in 2007 to provide support to SASEAS administration and faculty in the fostering of awareness, understanding and acceptance of our Catholic faith and traditions. Since its inception, the group has undertaken several projects: providing the prayer banners in the Seton and St. Andrew Campus gymnasiums; sending home rosaries for families during October and May; preparing special treats for students during Lent and Advent; celebrating birthdays for Pope Benedict and Mary; supporting St. Vincent DePaul with food drives and Easter treats for clients; and praying the Rosary together each month.

For the last three years, Living Our Faith spearheaded SASEAS School's participation in "Operation Shoebox," an international program that provides shoeboxes filled with treats for poor children around the world. What began as a small endeavor has grown into a faith-filled service project for SASEAS school children and families. Last year, we donated 275 boxes.
